ROADWORKS

The construction crew have completed a 3.5km section of South Walgoolan Road and a 1km section of 6 Mile Gate Road with the Polymer stabilizing product.

A 4.6km section of Warralakin Road has had its old bitumen surface removed in preparation for new reconstruction works which will commence in January once harvest is completed.

The crew will be reconstructing the Carrabin South/Clothier Road intersection over the next two weeks.

FOOTPATHS

Footpath reconstruction will be carried out on a section of Wolfram Street this month prior to some additional streetscape initiatives that will continue to improve the amenity for the community.

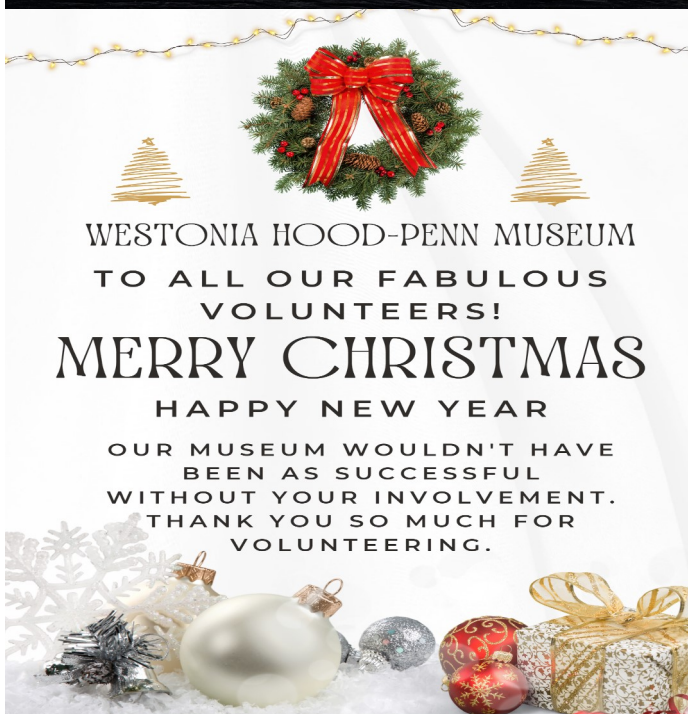

Hopefully the weather continues to warm up and there are not too many more weather interruptions to harvest. Having said that, the hot weather also increases the chances of Fire and Harvest Bans. There are two types of Fire Bans which may be imposed.

Total Fire Ban – imposed by DFES (Department of Fire and Emergency Services) A Total Fire Ban (TFB) is declared on days when fires are most likely to threaten lives and property. This is because of predicted extreme fire weather or when there are already widespread fires and firefighting resources are stretched. On a Total Fire Ban day, it is illegal to light an open-air fire or conduct any activity that could start a fire. Harvest and Vehicle Movement Bans – imposed by Shire of Westonia Harvest and Vehicle Movement Bans are issued by the Shire of Westonia during the Restricted and Prohibited Burning period (1st November 2022 – 15th February 2023) and are put in place when local Bushfire Control Officers identify the use of engines, vehicles, plant or machinery as high bushfire risk activities. It is your responsibility to find out if a ban is in place and the Shire of Westonia will

communicate Harvest Bans via SMS, and broadcast on ABC radio.

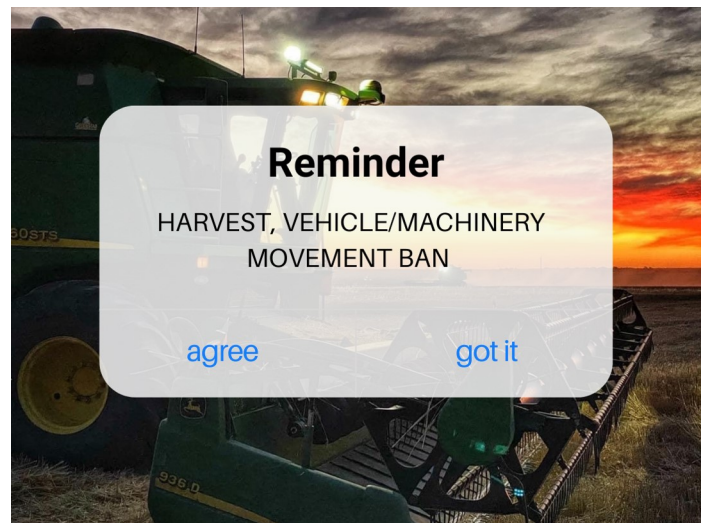

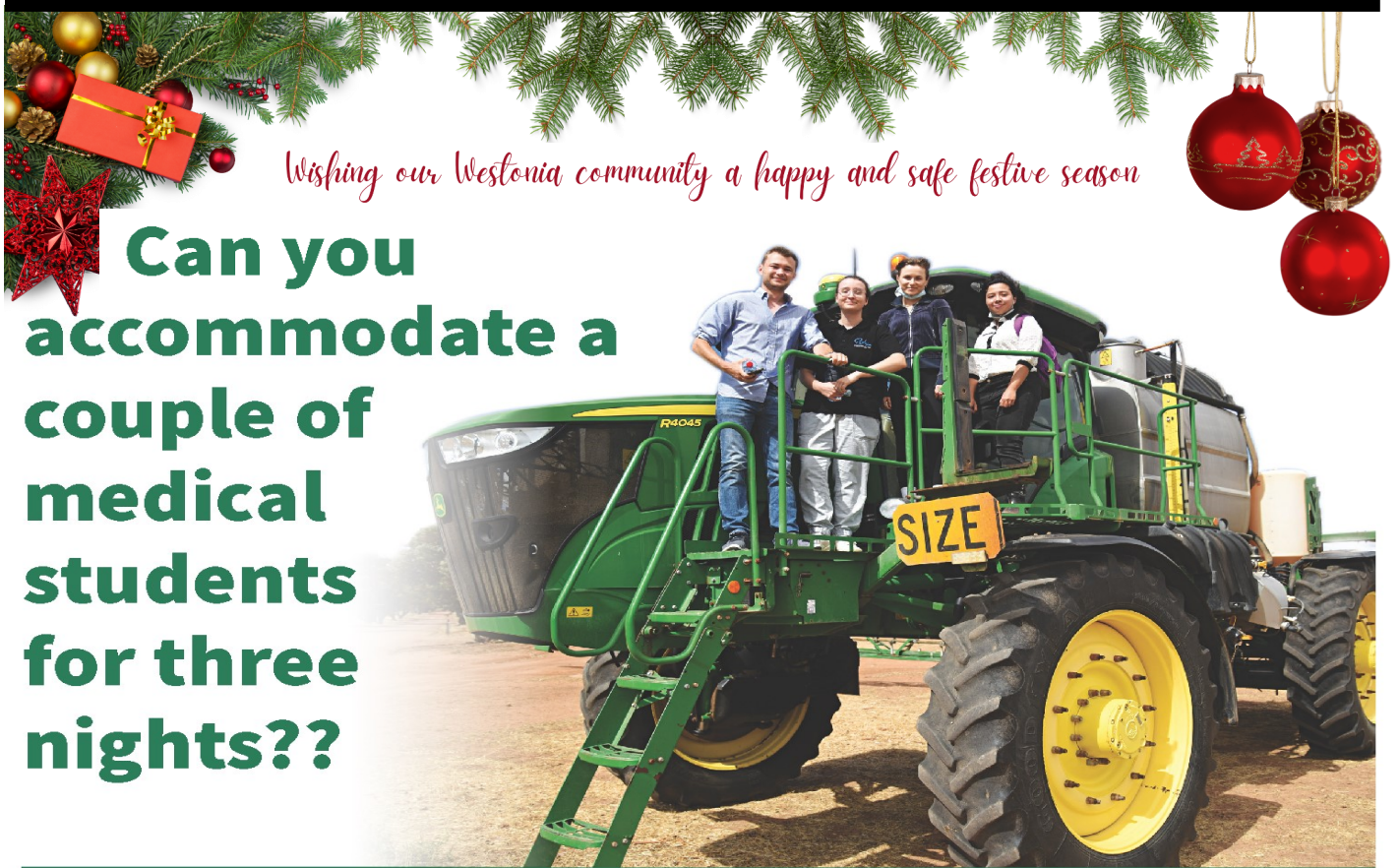

TUESDAY 14 TO FRIDAY 17 MARCH 2023

Share what living in the Wheatbelt is like with doctors of the future

One hundred medical students will be coming to the Wheatbelt in March 2023. During their stay, they will visit local farms, industry, general practices, hospitals and schools, and participate in community activities.

We need you to provide real-life experiences that will give them an understanding of what it is like to live in the Wheatbelt and perhaps inspire them to become rural doctors.

The students will visit the following towns:

- Bruce Rock
- Kellerberrin/Tammin
- Merredin
- Southern Cross
- Westonia
- Narrogin

As a host, we will ask you to provide accommodation for two or more students, be able to assist with transporting them to/from town, and share what it is like to live in your town with the students. You are invited to come along to a Thank You dinner with the students on the Thursday night.

Why host?

Even if you need the students to roll out a swag in the living room, we want to hear from you if you can host.

This is a life-changing experience for the students, with many having no previous exposure to rural life or the Wheatbelt.

By providing these rural immersion opportunities early in their degree, it has been proven that students are more likely to explore rural career opportunities.

Some students continue to keep in touch and visit their host families, some return to do seasonal work and placements, others have joined mentoring programs, some have inspired host family members to pursue tertiary studies in health and medicine, and some students are now doctors in the Wheatbelt and other parts of rural/remote WA and Australia.

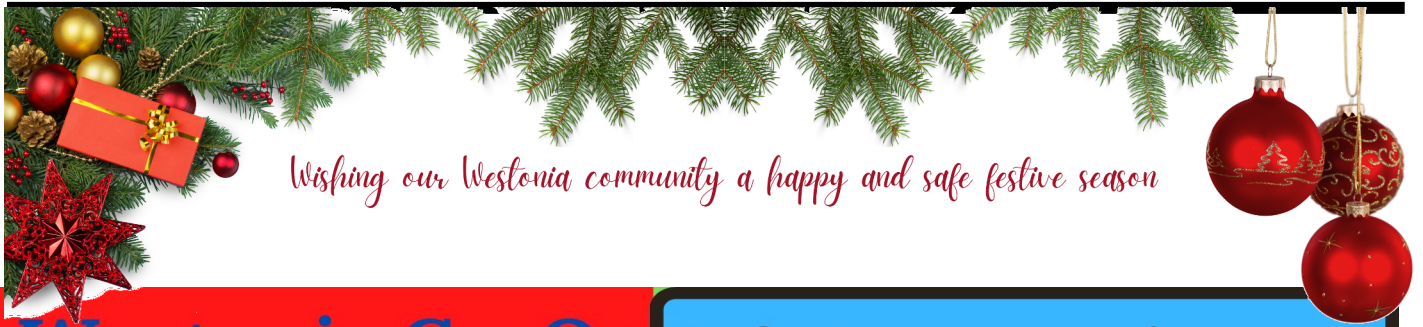
Thank you to our volunteers, Arthur, Jonsey, Heather, Dawes, Diane, Fred and any other member who assisted over the two nights.

Work has begun on applications, for the Shire of Westonia, to become a Home & Community Care (HACC) provider. If successful the Shire will be able to provide Domestic support, Gardening/ Home Maintenance, Transport and will be able to support existing programs such as wellbeing activities, nursing and other health related areas. The initial application to Australian Government Aged Care Quality and Safety Commission will take a few months to be approved, then we can make application to the Australian Government department of health. Once approved the community will be able to take applications for this program. Approved applicants will include the elderly and frail, people with disabilities and carers who require assistance.
