# EID INFRASTRUCTURE GRANTS PROGRAM

The WA Government has announced a \$3.52M grants package to help the sheep and goat industry prepare for a smooth transition to the new national eID system.

A first round of closed grants has been offered directly to saleyards, abattoirs, export depots, registered feedlots and livestock agents to integrate eID technology and equipment into their business. Grants will be used to purchase eID scanners, readers, wands and essential eID tools and materials, as well as undertake limited works to accommodate eID technologies.

A second round of competitive grants valued at \$10,000 each, opened on 1 March and closed on 17 May 2024. The infrastructure grants were available to smaller, seasonal downstream market operators as well as community and grower groups. # PUBLIC NOTICE SHIRE OF WESTONIA LOCAL LAWS 2024

In accordance with s3.12 of the *Local Government Act* 1995, the Shire of Westonia gives public notice that the Council of the Shire of Westonia resolved on 28 May 2024 to commence making the following local laws for the district.

#### **Historic Precinct Local Law 2024**

<u>Purpose:</u> To prescribe the design of development, including buildings and fencing, within the Westonia Historical Precinct.

<u>Effect:</u> The effect of this local law is to prescribe the design of development, including buildings and fencing, within the Westonia Historical Precinct.

#### Sea-Containers Local Law 2024

<u>Purpose</u>: To prescribe the approval process required for the placement of shipping and/or sea containers on residential, commercial, and industrial land within the Westonia townsite.

<u>Effect:</u> The effect of this local law is to establish minimum requirements for the placement of shipping and/or sea containers on land within the Westonia townsite.

#### Fencing Local Law 2024

<u>Purpose:</u> To prescribe a sufficient fence and the standard for the construction of fences throughout the district.

<u>Effect:</u> The effect of this local law is to establish the minimum requirements for fencing within the district

#### Repeal Local Law 2024

<u>Purpose:</u> To repeal local laws that have been superseded by other legislation.

<u>Effect:</u> The effect of this local law is to ensure the local laws are repealed.


